

Learning SEO: The Quick Start Guide for Beginners

(Look around before you settle on a set of sites to read. SEO information on the web is of highly variable quality, so finding sites that will not mislead you is vital.) You will quickly find yourself spending less and less time in article directories and on "how to" sites, and more time on SEO forums and blogs. This is a sign of progress. It means you have mastered the basics of SEO and are looking for breaking news and advanced techniques.

Keeping your knowledge of SEO and all the developments in the field up to date is essential. As search engines change their algorithms to weed out spammers, web professionals must change how they write, code, and design their sites. Missing a new development can be the difference between the first page of the search results and the 317th page. You can catch breaking developments in SEO by reading the best forums and blogs, and web specialist conventions and seminars will hone your competitive edge.

As you can see, learning SEO is not as simple as taking a class and getting an official "SEO master" certificate at the end. First you need to learn the basics, then you need to stay on top of new developments. However, once you have the basics of SEO down, an hour or two a week is all it takes to stay current in the field. Keep plugging away, and soon you, too, will have an advanced understanding of SEO.
