

How To File An Internet Domain Registration

It is not difficult to process an Internet domain registration. All it takes to register one or more domain names is an internet connection. The basic requirements are a domain registrar, a domain name, entry of essential information, and payment to the registrar. Of course, lack of knowledge of the basic terminology or about how the process of Internet domain registration is managed can make it seem anything but simple. This can result in a reluctance to initiate the process. Registrar, domain, domain name...what exactly does it mean? If you do not think you have the full concept, this article may be helpful.

Domain means the Internet website itself. Domain name is the location of the site, often referred to as the Internet address. A domain registrar is an approved company, or website, which will collect the required information for Internet domain registration, submit your domain name to the central database, and maintain your domain registration records. You have a broad choice of sites which function as domain registrars. A Web host will not only process your Internet domain registration, but will help you build and maintain a website as well. If you do not have a strong technical background, filing your Internet domain registration through a Web hosting site may be the answer.

The hardest part of completing an Internet domain registration may be finding an available domain name. The Internet domain name has a defined layout and must be one of a kind. Following the standard www the domain name consists of a name, then what is known as an extension. Today there are many extensions to choose from, but you are probably most familiar with .com or .net. An example might be www.myownwebsite.com. It is wise to choose a name that indicates the nature of your website. The combination of the name and extension cannot be registered by anyone else. The Internet has a governing body, ICANN, which ensures each domain name is unique, and that the required information is collected during the Internet domain registration. Access to the information stored from the Internet domain registration process is available on the InterNIC website. This database is called WHOIS.

The good news is you can check the availability of your chosen name on the registrar website. If your choice is not available, the search may provide alternate names, which you can select. If none are satisfactory, you can enter a new name and search again until you find an available name that suits your need. Now you are on your way. Fill out the required information and file. File the form. You have completed your Internet domain registration and the registrar will notify you by email when it is available.
